## Laundromat Library League Adds More States and Local Sites

The Laundromat Library League has new laundromat sites in the East Stroudsburg area (4 of them), Conshohocken, a first in Lansdale, and several new ones in Philadelphia. We have developed networks to get books and decorated boxes to them. We have someone working on Allentown.

We also now have branches in California (Oakland, 2 laundromats at present) and Idaho, and we will soon have a presence in Navajo County, Arizona (the poorest county in the state). We have new sites in the New York, New Jersey, and Delaware branches as well. We are now over 90 sites with "Library Boxes" of children's books and an invitation for children or their caregivers to take them.

In our local area we have a new partnership with Elwyn to offer job-training activities to at least a few of its students. We have a similar arrangement with Community Integrated Services, an agency that assists in the development of job-related skills for people with disabilities. Although CIS has many locations, the Philadelphia site is presently engaged in recruiting laundromats and placing and stewarding Library Boxes there.

In addition to laundromats in this area, we have placed Library Boxes of children's books in the

Lord's Pantry, the West Chester Food Bank, the CHOP clinic in Coatesville, and the 3 sites that Chester County Women's Services maintains as "crisis pregnancy centers" in which they offer parenting classes, free pregnancy tests, and other supports for disadvantaged mothers and mothers-to-be.



The LLL now is 3 1/3 years old and in that time has received and processed over 40,000 children's books that have been donated by individuals, schools, libraries, and organizations. We have used donated funds to purchase additional books for needed categories (e.g., books in Spanish). We are grateful that AAUW keeps a basket out at meetings for monetary donations, needed for the purchase of supplies. In 2017 the AAUW donations came to just over \$100. All those loose bills add up!!! Thank you!!! The two young women who helped carry the goodies were delighted with everything. When we learned about the Resource Pantry last year, they were serving about 20 students, some of whom were homeless, all of whom experienced food insecurity. Typically, four or five students a week would come visit the Pantry to pick up food, clothing, and household supplies. This number has grown as word of the Pantry has spread. Just today, 17 students had visited the Pantry before my visit in the mid-afternoon.

## Guidelines for AAUW some

1. Deadline for articles is the  $10^{th}$  of the month prior to publication – e.g., October 10, December 10, January 10, etc.

2. Board will develop outline/plan for newsletter.

3. Copies of each newsletter article must be sent to the President and the President Elect.

4. Articles should be less then 340 words (1 column in 12 pt.) and sent as .doc (Word) files whenever possible.

5. Program information should be available for publication in the month prior to the event.

6. SIG information should be specific (when, where, leader, contact info., program or book).

7. Photos should be sent in .jpg format and should be the best quality possible. Leave cropping to the editors when possible. Be sure to provide names of the people and description of the happening in the photo.

8. Editors must keep newsletter to 10 pages or less (5 printed front and back).

9. Editors must consult with President or designee if newsletter is too long.

10. Editors and President will determine number of copies to be printed.

11. Board will review and decide list of Friends who receive printed copies.

12. The newsletter should go to the printer by the 25th of the month. Copies should include the Circulation Manager, Person who distributes the e-mail version, and, if requested, other named designees.
