## GOALS FOR 2020-2021

The Board met on September 2<sup>nd</sup> with our focus on establishing branch goals for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. It is an aggressive list with many challenging opportunities for our 90 branch members to become involved and help continue our mission of advancing equity for women and girls.

#### **Goal 1- Five Star Recognition Program**

The Five Star Recognition Program was created by AAUW National to direct branches all across the United States to focus their goals in specific areas to keep them in line with National's mission statement. They broke out this program into 5 areas and each one that is achieved by June 30, 2021 will earn a star. We are researching each one of the 5 areas and at the Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> board meeting, we will determine which stars are attainable for our branch.

#### The 5 areas are:

**Programs** - Holding strategic plan-related programs, for example Work Smart Online Training Day.

Advancement – Retaining 90% of branch membership, increase greatest needs giving by 25% to National.

**Communication & External Relations** – Web and Social Media Presence

**Public Policy & Research** – Host at least one public event where Action Network sign-ups are collected or promote the Action Network on your website.

**Governance & Sustainability** – create a strategic and succession plan

\*Goal 3 – Continue Pay Equity/Work Smart/Start Smart – Provide programs on these topics.

# Demand that your Senators <u>fight for a just and</u> <u>fair Supreme Court</u>.

Our nation is reeling from the COVID-19 pandemic, an economic crisis, reckoning with our long and painful history with racism, and

how to access the vote in a critical election year. But the Senate is refusing to consider legislative relief. Instead, they have abandoned this great responsibility to focus on expediting a process to ram through a politically opportune nominee for one of the most important jobs in the country. A full and fair vetting process is vital to determine the nominee's qualifications and temperament, but it takes time and consideration. The Senate has previously shown that they are willing to disregard this duty by rubber-stamping the *past two* Supreme Court nominations. The Senate must prioritize the health and safety of the country over political power—conducting a rushed hearing process would harm our nation for generations.

We hold Justice Ginsburg's memory as inspiration: continue the fight for gender equity and representation where decisions are made. This election year, we are elevating the voices of all people in the selection of all branches of their government. It is critical that the Senate honor the people's part in the selection of our next Supreme Court Justice.

#### **Take Action**

Tell them to protect our right to decide on Justice Ginsburg's successor – AFTER inauguration!

## **Be Prepared for the Election**

As we head into the last few months before the election, it is important to know your options, the deadlines, and where to get information.

Be sure you are registered to vote. October 19 is the last day to register or update your voter registration. October 27 is the last day to apply for a no excuse mail-in-ballot, but don't wait. Do it now! As soon as you

get it, complete the ballot and mail it or drop off at your county election office or its satellite offices.

If you prefer to vote in person, check on your polling place by November 2. Many may be moved because of Covid-19.

Do all of this at <u>VotesPA.com</u>. You can even find out how to be a poll worker.

While the news focuses on the Presidential election, many others running for office have an even more significant impact on our lives. All 18 of our Pennsylvania congressional representatives are running as are all 203 state representatives and half (25) of our state senators.

AAUW is non-partisan and does not endorse candidates, but it is important to know where candidates stand before you cast your vote. You can download a <u>Head-to-Head Federal Election Guide Template</u> where you can compare congressional candidates' stands on AAUW issues.

A guide for state senators and representatives in Harrisburg is available at <u>Resources for November 3</u>, 2020. Check AAUW's 2020 Gender Policy Agenda, which outlines our priority issues at the federal and state level that impact Economic Security, Education, and Foundational Rights. The agenda includes specific Pennsylvania legislation.
